_____ The section of highway or street from the downstream end of the work area to the last traffic control device where motorists are returned to their normal path.

_____ A pre-determined route free of obstructions that enables the Traffic Regulator to maneuver away from the errant vehicles or equipment.

_____ An area located off the traveled portion of the roadway that is clear of obstructions and provided sufficient clear distance for approaching traffic to see the Traffic Regulator and stop at an intended stopping point.
